MARTY'S MEMORIES

Sometime in the early seventies, a call came in to open a small safe at a restaurant supply store in a town nearby. Upon arrival, I saw a small cast iron Hall safe. Easy money - I drilled a small hole, lined up the gates, and BINGO! After unlocking the safe, I had the manager open the door.

While he was removing the contents, he told me that someone was coming from the bowling alley nearby to look at it and hopefully buy it. When the manager asked me what a reasonable price would be, I had to give him a high number since he had to pay me \$195.00 for the opening and repair (Remember now, this was in the 1970's).
