MARTY'S MEMORIES

It is hard to believe as it is more than 50 years ago but I will never forget my very first serve call.

Let me start from the beginning. I started my own business after working for M.Taylor at 11th and Filbert in Philadelphia as a cutlery grinder, a trade I had learned in Holland before I came to this Country in 1957.

M.Taylor was a retail and service shop doing sharpening, locksmithing and door closer repairs. During the 6 years I was employed there I picked up a lot of locksmithing knowledge by taking old locks out of the junk barrel and cutting them open to see how they worked. I also took a Locksmithing correspondence course. Dick Mitchel, who was the locksmith in charge refuse to giving any information or show anything related to locksmithing, like it was a trade secret. But I learned more there than he ever expected.

In 1964 I quit my job and opened a Locksmith and Sharpening shop. Because I loved playing with combination locks I enrolled and graduated a Safe Manipulation course. The walk-in business was limited, so to include outside service I bought a step van. I had ordered an ad in the Lock and Safe section of the yellow pages and also put one in the local paper. Arnold's Safe & Lock Co was in business. Yes, I was ready to roll.

Now to the heart of the story

The very first call for service was from the Simplex time clock company in Moorestown. Arriving there I was shown a time clock with a small lever lock that they needed keys made for. I was shocked out of my shoes, how the heck am I going to do this. My impression practice was with pin tumbler cylinders and wafer locks.

The Locksmith course I had taken did taught me something on locker and lever locks. I cut down a blank to size and remembered to smoke it and wiggle it in the lock. Two gentlemen where watching every move I made. I removed the key from the lock and saw two shiny marks. I filed them away just a few thousands deep with the side of my 4 inch flat file, inserted the key again and BINGO the lock opened.

But this was not the only reason I remember my first job. When the lock opened the one gentlemen said to the other. See John, I told you, I told you to call this guy

He is one of the best locksmiths in the State!

After this experience, I do not put much value in personal recommendations.

From Marty's Collection My Herring Vault Lock



I was called by a contractor who was in the process of demolishing a bank building, and he asked me if I was interested in some of the safes on the property. After inspecting the premisses late that day, I told him I was interested in the vault locks and a 3 movement Sargent & Greenleaf time lock. I offered him \$500.00 and my offer was accepted, and told him I would come in the next day remove the locks. To my horror, that beautifully engraved time lock was destroyed by vandals when I got there, and I renegotiated the price down to \$200.00

Removing the 6 Herring vault locks was really a puzzle, as no screws were visible to remove the back cover and when I forced the first cover of, I noticed it was held with a spring loaded retainer that could be depressed through a small hole on the bolt side of the lock. The other side has a small stud locking it in place. To save time we put all parts of the six locks in a big box then, found out later they were hand fitted. Each part of a lock had the same number as the lock case so I had a big job later in my shop to match each piece to a lock.

I donated a lock like the one above on a nice display mount to the SAVTA's auction and was bought by Ken Foo for \$2000,00

I sold the others to members of SAVTA.
