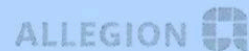

In my time I received many calls to open safes. A death in the family, a burglarized unit, or a lost combination. This safe opening request came in because the dishwasher stopped working.

The call went like this, *"I'd like to get a price on opening a safe. My dishwasher broke down and repair would take a week, so I purchased a dish basin at Walmart. After we had a bite and a drink, I asked who was in charge and told him we would unlock the safe and he would have to be there to actually open it. Every one present wanted to witness it as it actually was a neighbors safe opening party. They all had chipped in to pay our bill and would share the contents.

Chuck drilled a small hole at the right location, scoped it and unlocked the safe. The man in charge opened the door with every one looking on andyes, it was empty. Some disappointing remarks were heard and then everyone started laughing. We both were invited to stay and join the party and when we finally left, it was still going strong between a real happy bunch of neighborly people.
