Norton/LifeLock suggestions

What is this Dark Web notification and why are you receiving this?

The exposed information is potentially associated with the website/service aloamembers.org.

In the past you may have signed up for aloamembers.org, or provided the information to a service that is in some way associated with aloamembers.org. It may be difficult for you to remember, or you simply may not know other services are associated with aloamembers.org. What is important to know is that information belonging to you appears as if it is being shared improperly on the dark web.

Exposed information from data breaches, hacking incidents, or leaked information can be bought and sold on the dark web as "lists". The buying and selling activity by identity thieves may occur months to years after it is actually exposed in a security incident.

Even though you may have stopped using aloamembers.org, or perhaps deactivated the account, or maybe unsubscribed, the information could still be available in their systems.

What can you do next?

Being proactive with best practices and next steps, such as the following, can help:

If your notification mentions an email, change the password associated with it. It has been exposed.

If your notification mentions an affected website, do also change the password to it, or to any other site where you've used the password.

Choose a new, unique, and strong password for each individual site you use. Don't use the same password each time.

Review your credit reports and watch for new credit inquiry alerts or suspicious activity. Consider freezing your credit file.



ODD & OBSCURE HARDWARE

How many times have you found an old, odd, or obscure piece of hardware buried on a shelf somewhere in your shop. I found a few more.

Yale came out with a rim lock they called the Security Latch lock. It was a rim night latch with a different type of mounting feature. The back plate used to hold the exterior rim cylinder was also the mounting plate for the lock body. The plate has 2 hooked plates and is bent 90 degrees on the end that goes to the edge of the door. The lock body is place over the plate, slid towards the hinges to hook under the hooked plates, and 2 screws on the edge of the lock secure it to the plate. The only mounting screws are visible only from the lock body.





How many out there remember the Ideal Security jimmy proof lock? The one pictured would be installed place of the knob lock and fit right into the 2 1/8" cross bore in the door. The lip strike would be removed and the angle strike cut into the frame. The roller latch would be installed in place of the old deadlatch and would hold the door shut by engaging into the cutout in the angle strike. Unfortunately, the inside handles had a tendency to break off making it difficult if not impossible to open the door from the inside, and once these units were discontinued, there were repairs necessary for the frame to look presentable.

These 2 locks are just a few more unique and interesting pieces I've come across that I still have for one reason or another. I'm thinking there may be more buried in the shop that somehow survived our move in 2009 and I'll bring them out as they are rediscovered. Maybe you have something unusual to share with everyone as well? Please do.


